



C&C 99 Sail Inventory Survey

The tuning guides have indicated sail inventory suggestions for the C&C 99 class based primarily on One-Design racing and windward leeward courses. While the class has been rejuvenated through the re-establishment of the C&C 99 Class website and Facebook group the opportunity to race one-design has been limited as boats change hands, relocate and active racers age and change their sailing/racing activities. Additionally, increased use of sprits and asymmetrical spinnakers have resulted in changes to once well-established sail inventories. Now the C&C 99s are primarily racing PHRF in area and club events. To get a handle on what people are using in their sail inventories to enhance opportunities to explore class discount with sailmakers we have developed the following questionnaire to determine the sails currently being used across the C&C 99 fleet.
